Story #1: Dapanjali Pradhan upskilling her way out of poverty



Dipanjali Pradhan excelled at school. She lives in Shikharchado Nagar, a large informal settlement in the city of **Bhubaneswar**, where most women work as housemaids in adjoining wealthier areas. Once she became of high school age, there was pressure on her to quit studies and start contributing to family income

by becoming a house maid, as many of her school friends had done. Dipanjali knew that her family's financial situation was not good enough to cover her increased education expenses. That is when Dipanjali enrolled in the Digital Literacy program supported by **Asia Initiatives'** with our partner **VIEWS**. She excelled in this program also, and soon became the first person in her family to learn computer skills. She also taught them to younger children to earn **SoCCs** to continue her own learning. Today, she has a job as a computer operator and a patient manager at a local hospital. Her salary contributes to her family's income, and is also enough to pay for more advanced computer courses for herself. Dipanjali hopes that her own path to upskilling can be replicated for many more girls in Bhubashwar.



Story #2: Sagar's Journey Through Reading

"I am feeling energized with my new routine and I am loving the small practices like meditation, waking up early, and being compassionate in my actions. Reading Buddha gave me strength and curiosity to know more about life and how it can be made better." This is what Sagar, a Class 8 student in Azmabad said when he come to return the book Gautham Buddha he had borrowed from the new library that Asia Initiatives has established with our partner Mera Gaon Meri Dayuni (Sparsh). Together, we have established 20 libraries in rural Madhya Pradesh incentivizing children like Sagar to fall in love with books, and spread this love to younger children also to earn SoCCs, which can be used for other learning opportunities.
