## Education + vocational/entrepreneurial skills at Vidhyalay Udhyam





The first stop for Surabhi and Carley was at Vidhyalay Udhyam (VU) in Udaipur, where education, critical thinking, vocational skills and entrepreneurship training intertwine to empower the next generation. Our team members interacted with the enthusiastic students and educators, experiencing first-hand the dynamic learning environment that VU fosters. Visiting some of the 20 government schools where this project is active, our team was impressed with the way students take charge of their own learning journey. VU is all set to transform learning for over 10,000 students in three years, using

## Capacity Building at Mera Gaon Meri Dunia (MGMD)





At MGMD, Surabhi and Carley led capacity building sessions, sharing tools and knowledge in crucial areas such as sexual health, financial literacy, grant writing, and leveraging Chat GPT for enhancing program delivery. These discussions will echo through all of MGMD's work. By empowering village youth to take ownership of teaching and learning at local schools, MGMD has successfully transformed **20 villages**, ensuring running water, electricity, and vastly improved educational outcomes. about the success of participatory development that fosters a strong sense of solidarity and self-reliance among the communities. You can read more about this initiative <u>HERE</u>.


